As a school, we have already taken steps towards increasing whanau engagement by developing 'learning focused relationships' and raising student achievement. This mahi (work) is vital to us ensuring our students are successful as they progress through school and into adulthood. I am hopeful that the start we have made will continue and our school will be the centre of our community.

Lockdown - You may be aware that the school was placed into a 'Lock down' last Friday at 3:30pm. This was a precautionary measure taken by the Police. Our Lockdown procedure worked well and we followed it successfully, however, it is timely that we review the process and incorporate any new steps recommended by the Ministry of Education following the recent events in Christchurch. Once this review has taken place, we will put it on to the website and a link on Facebook. I was very impressed with the speed and care taken by our staff and the SKiDs team in ensuring all children were safely accounted for and kept quietly amused in the staffroom.

Our amazing oak tree – has now been felled and there is an open space at the front of the school. This space will be landscaped to have some interactive steps and beams, native plants and our waharoa (gateway). We are very excited about the development of this entry way. Welcome to Atua Asafo – Atua is our new Samoan Bilingual teacher. She will be joining us on Monday 29 April. Atua is an experienced teacher and we are excited to have her joining our team next term. There will be a Samoan Parents Network Meeting this evening.

Farewell – It is with sadness that I am informing our community that Shirley Martin will be leaving us next term. Shirley has been an integral part of our school for 27 years and has held many roles from teacher to Acting Co-Principal. Most recently Shirley has been running a literacy support programme called the Book Worm Club, which many of our children have attended. There will be a formal farewell to Shirley next term.

Korero and Coffee – The first evening coffee and korero will be held tonight at 6pm in the staffroom. This is an ideal time for parents who have other commitments during the school day. This is a really relaxed meeting with opportunities to mix and talk freely with other parents and members of the Senior Leadership Team.
