Kia ora Whanau

Welcome back. What a crazy start to the year it has been with 4 days back and then a lockdown! Please be assured that school is a safe place to be, our processes are well established and we want your children here so they can build relationships and reach their personal goals.

Unfortunately during level 2 we require parents to remain off-site during transition times, where there is a very low, but possible, opportunity for contact. These times are before school 8:15am – 9am, and pick up time 2:30pm – 3pm. We have returned to the gates being locked and access restricted. If you do need to access the school, please contact the office and they will let you in (09) 833 7480. Once at school, we require you to sign in using the Covid QR code and use the sanitiser provided. If your child is just new to school, please contact Hannah King the Pohutukawa Team Leader through the school office or via email to arrange an alternative to walking your child to their classroom or picking them up.

As there is a restriction on gathering sizes (less than 100) during level 2, we will be unable to have our Mihi Whakatau next week or our planned Whanau Sports Day. Both of these important events have been postponed until later in the term. We will get an updated term calendar out to you shortly.

It is always important to keep your child home if they are sick, however, this is especially true at this time. If your child becomes unwell during the day, we will require them to be picked up. This is to ensure they have a speedy recovery, but also to protect the health of our students and staff. We really appreciate your support with this.

Welcome to our new families to the school. Remember to like and request to join our Facebook page — Lincoln Heights School Official, and to download the free Skool Loop app for the latest updates, and newsletters. Newsletters are also put up on to our website fortnightly on a Wednesday.

Welcome to new teachers to our school in 2021 – Losi Hunter is in Rm 3 and teaching Yr 0-2 in our Samoan Bilingual unit, Emily Bingham is in Rm 17 teaching Yr 5/6, and Rachel Pattemore is in Rm 23 teaching Yr 7/8. These amazing women bring strengths and a passion for teaching and learning and we are excited that they have joined our learning community.

Free School Lunches have begun and we are excited by the variety of meals being provided! I want to thank the team at Spotless Catering for providing 1,000 wraps during lockdown and all the families that were able to enjoy them. I know I loved mine heated up in the toasted sandwich maker. As with anything new, there will be teething problems, but the team at Spotless are quick to respond to our feedback. I do encourage you to pop an extra snack into your child's lunch box if they are a particularly picky eater. Unfortunately we cannot send out a menu each week, but would ask that you encourage your child to at least try the meal.

We have a position available sorting and delivering the lunches to classes each day – the position is for 15 hours per week (3 hours per day) during term time 11am – 2pm. The pay rate is \$21.84 per hour. The role involves sorting the lunches into class lots and delivering them to classrooms. The successful applicant will need to pay attention to detail and be physically able to lift a full bread tray – approximately 12kgs. Children with allergies are having their meals prepared and packaged separately and they arrive at school on a special tray with each child's name. This includes children who have special dietary requirements for religious reasons. If your child has allergies or their allergies have changed, please let the office know as soon as possible so we can update our records. For children with allergies we will be in touch to get a safety plan to ensure we have the most appropriate response for them.



August and Winter are back at school. They are particularly fond of the ends of broccoli and cauliflower at the moment, though like children, their tastes change quite regularly. If you do have any leftovers after making dinner, please send them along with your child and they will be happily munched up and appreciated by the goats. They have definitely grown over the summer break and have missed the attention from their many adoring fans at school. I must say driving to school with them today was interesting and I got a lot of curious looks from other drivers!

A reminder to parents that should any personal details change, including address/phone numbers, please email us at lhs@lincolnheights.school.nz so that we can update our records. In the event of an emergency, having correct contact details is crucial for communicating with you.

If your child is on medication and needs this administered during school hours, please send it to the office, clearly marked with your child's full name and classroom number. This message also applies for inhalers, keeping a spare at school is helpful in the event it is needed.

Terms one and four are sunhat terms. It is compulsory for all children to wear a hat during break times. Please clearly mark your child's hat and ensure they have it in their bag every day. Our policy is 'no hat, no play'.

Before and After School Care – SkiDS run before and after school care at Lincoln Heights at affordable rates. SKiDS have moved back to their old room, Rm 28, beside the library. Contact Sam direct for bookings.

Room number changes – you may have noticed that the room numbers around the school have changed and that our teams are now located in different areas. These changes were made in response to a number of rooms being removed off our site and to allow us to have sequenced room numbers. If you are not sure where your child's class is, please ask for directions at the office.

If you are visiting school to drop off lunches or help in the classroom (which we will welcome once we are back in level 1) please sign in at the office. All visitors at the school must be recorded as a health and safety requirement.
