I know that as the teachers across New Zealand cast their vote, they are doing so with mixed emotions, recognising the unsettled few years we have had with the need to better address inequities at school. I know that should industrial action by way of a strike, be the outcome, you will support us. As soon as the BoT has been notified, (we expect this to come out later today or tomorrow) we will update you all through skool loop, Facebook and eTap.
