Kia ora Whanau

This term is flying by, its already week 8 of a 10 week term. This term has been very busy with Camp, upcoming trips, assessments, and not least Parent Teacher interviews.

Our school goal for parent interviews is 90% attendance. This time we achieved 80.5% across the school. A great achievement, but I know we can reach that 90% goal in term 3! We had some classes however, who exceeded the 90% goal. Congratulations to Room 15 who had 100% of their families attend Parent Interviews, Room 22 and Potu 6 had 95%, Room 18 had 94% Room 13 had 92% and Potu 5 91%!! The Team with the highest attendance across all classes was Moemoe Fou with 91% average.

Attendance and engagement is one of our school goals – we aim to have an 80% attendance and engagement rate for all children. We know that with the disruptions of COViD and the recent weather event, getting children to school every day is vital. If a child misses just one day a week, that equates to nearly a term of learning over a year. It impacts on not just a child's learning and progress, but also their relationships. Regular school attendance leads to better educational outcomes and supports ongoing attendance at high school. We understand that children get sick and in families of multiple children, this can equate to a few days (or longer) as the illness passes through the whole family, but we encourage you to bring your child to school unless they are sick. If your child needs a jacket so they can attend school on rainy days, please let us know. Attendance is a national priority for the Ministry of Education. We are working closely with the Tamaki Makaurau School Truancy Service to ensure all children are able to attend school regularly. If your child is unwell, please let the school know, either via email, text or phone call. You may be thinking that's a bit rich coming from you when the school closes for professional development during the term. When a school plans a Teacher Only Day on a usual school day, this day is added on to the end of the school year, ensuring that every school is open for the same number of days.

Another huge thank you to our Board and to our school community for supporting our teachers in closing the school for instruction for the NZEI National Teachers Strike last week. As teaching professionals we believe in quality education across Aotearoa for all tamariki. Our teachers have a passion for delivering that education, and believe our tamariki would benefit from some government changes. We know how difficult it was for you to support us in closing the school for instruction as many of us are parents too. One of the biggest challenges education is facing today is inadequate classroom support for students with learning or behavioural needs. Many children who deserve and need learning support to reach their potential, are not eligible to receive it and teachers are struggling to adequately support all the children in their class. We pride ourselves on being an inclusive school and believe in the right of every child to receive a quality education in their local school. We are proud to be a school recognised for being adaptive and inclusive and our Board is committed to ensuring we do as much we can to support every learner. We want the government to also support our learners, our tamariki and ensure there are equitable outcomes for all children. If you have any questions or comments regarding why teachers and principals across the motu are striking, please come in and see me or talk to your child's teacher. Once again thank you for your support, we appreciate and value you.
