

Kia ora whānau

TRANSPORT SURVEY - Thank you to everyone who has completed the **Auckland Transport survey** on parking around our school. The survey was uploaded to Skool Loop on 9 June for you to have your say. If you haven't already, you can still complete the survey via this link <u>transport survey</u>. We will be closing the survey on Friday and sharing the results with Auckland Transport – Waka Kotahi.

We have had more than 95 respondents with a range of strong opinions. In response to the School Street trial it was very even with 31% 'no' to a trial, 31% 'yes' and 33% maybe – many of whom wanted more information.

There were some questions about what is within school control. As a school we aren't responsible for parking on the road. We do man two school crossings, one on Waimumu Rd which is controlled by the lollipops and the Lilburn Road crossing, which is controlled by a kea crossing. Teachers manning the Lilburn Road crossing are unable to actually stop moving traffic, but can cross children when there is a safe gap.

There were some questions about what the school is responsible for, can pay for or control. I thought I would try to answer some of the questions here.

- The Board would be unable to spend money on the development of any carparking even locally raised funds. This is because we are a Crown Entity and property is owned by the Ministry of Education. There are also restrictions on when we can increase our 'footprint'. The construction of a carpark is not something the Ministry of Education is likely to fund or approve. The school has just over 60 staff the majority park within the school gates. This is because they are here all day. Some of our support staff who start later, now park on the road as we don't have enough carparks.
- As a school we try hard to remind people to treat each other with kindness and to park safely. We cannot personally enforce parking rules. Teachers aren't expected to monitor the road and ensure that whanau park safely or respectfully.
- The school doesn't make any money off the parking wardens issuing tickets. When the parking wardens are there, they are working on behalf of Waka Kotahi and not the school. Similarly, school can't pay for tickets issued when a car is parked illegally.
- The bus stop needs to be kept clear for buses hired by the school or for school purposes. It isn't for public transport. We can't move it up the road as it is used for trips, swimming and tech.
- We have made the suggestion of Keegan Drive being 'one way' to Waka Kotahi, but this is harder to enforce. The concern with this
 option or having a 'pick up zone', is the distance between the school gate and Waimumu Road and that whanau would park on Keegan
 Drive from 2pm, effectively closing the road.
- If the School Road trial goes ahead, children will be walked down to the Keegan Road park by two staff in a group. The teachers would
 wait for all children to be collected and then return to school. Any uncollected children would then be walked back up the hill. At this
 stage the trial is planned for both before and after school, but with staggered drop off times, before school isn't as unsafe as after
 school.
- The trial isn't about keeping our front entrance 'tidy'. It is about making it safe for our children, neighbours and community. There are days where taxis cannot enter our carpark to pick up children and emergency services would struggle to access our front gate. Our priority is to create a safe entry and exit from our Keegan Drive carpark.
- We can provide Kidscan jackets please come in and see the office if you need one. These are awesome and warm.

Many schools have challenges at their gates which are compounded by properties being subdivided, growing rolls and less children walking to school. We are not alone in this problem.

Bathroom Update – our school is cleaned by an external cleaning company. We have spoken to them about ensuring that any health hazards are reported to the office. Thank you to the whanau that raised their concerns and to the whanau that gave us some awesome suggestions on how to remedy the problem. The issue has now been resolved. In regards to the school property upgrades, these will happen in October with 90% of the school bathrooms being completely replaced. If you have any concerns, please let us know via email or a call to the school office.

FALE development - Next term we will begin to work with our tamariki on an exciting development for our school, the building of a fale. This significant building project is being done in partnership with a Masters student from Auckland University. This project is very exciting and will be a great addition to our school. Our goal is to complete this project and have a special opening as part of Fiafia night on 5th

December.

Tuesday 16th September – votes counted





FALE DEVELOPMENT


