A warm welcome to our tamariki and whanau as we go into the third term of 2025. The fine weather has been a welcome change from the rain!

With our focus on student attendance, I look forward to sharing more regular data on how we are going. Our goal for this year is to have 60% of our children attending school for 95% of the time. We are currently sitting at 49%. If your child isn't at school, please let the office know so that we can ensure

their absence is coded correctly, by using the Skool Loop app or texting 022 0433 026.

Many of you will have seen the exciting news that we are getting 6 new classrooms! The timeline is for the project to break ground in February 2026. While we probably won't benefit from the new classrooms until October next year, hopefully we will have classes move in before the end of the year and be able to re-establish our library for 2027. The new two storey block will be built where the existing sports shed is located and we are exploring the possibility of including a slide from the second storey down ... as well as 2 sets of stairs!



#### Parent Teacher interviews are

coming up in Week 4 (Tues 5<sup>th</sup> and Weds 6<sup>th</sup> August). Again, we have opted to run these after school on each day to make attending more convenient for our families.

If this time won't work for you, please let your child's teacher know so an alternative time can be arranged. Understanding where your child is at in their learning is vital to improvement.

Out of Zone enrolments for the 2026 school year close on Wednesday 8 October 2025 and the ballot will be drawn Wednesday 15 October. If your child turns 5 in 2026, you don't have to wait until 2026. There are limited places available and once they are full, there will be no opportunity to enrol.

If you have a child turning 5 in 2026, please come in and enrol them - this helps us to plan and staff our new entrant and year 1 classes. Once a child is pre-enrolled, you will get a call closer to their 5th birthday to arrange school visits.


#### STUDENT LEARNING
