Kiorana and welcome to Cook Island Language week!



This week is busy with Parent Interviews and our Art Exhibition happening! There is still time to book a meeting for today if you haven't yet! Our goal is to have 90% of our parents attend a parent interview.

Our **Art Exhibition** is being held Tuesday 5 – Thursday 7 August. The Hall will be open late on Wednesday 6th August during Parent Teacher interviews so do pop in to see your child's artwork displayed. This year all our teachers have created a piece of art alongside their class and these will be displayed. There is also be the chance to vote for your favourite Art Battle piece!

We are so proud of our amazing artists and our staff who worked with them to produce such outstanding artworks.



Out of Zone Enrolments – if you have moved or you are now considered 'out of zone' and have younger children enrolling for the second half of the year, please complete an out of zone enrolment. We have very limited 'out of zone' places left in the main stream and priority goes to siblings of current students. We have some places available in Moemoe Fou and no places available in Kahukura – there is a waitlist.

Out of Zone enrolments for the 2026 school year close on Wednesday 8 October 2025 and the ballot will be drawn Wednesday 15 October. If your child turns 5 in 2026, you don't have to wait until 2026. There are limited places available and once they are full, there will be no opportunity to enrol if you are not in zone.

If you have a child turning 5 in 2026, please come in and enrol them – this helps us to plan and staff our new entrant and year 1 classes. Once a child is pre-enrolled, you will get a call closer to their 5th birthday to arrange school visits.


Teacher Only Days – these had to be moved to allow for the Ministry of Education facilitators to come in. They are on Friday 8 August and Monday 11 August.



Attendance continues to be a focus for the Ministry of Education and our Board. Our goal for this year is to have 60% or 312 students attending school for 90% of each term (that means having less than 5 days off). Last term, 39% or 208 students achieved this target.

Another change is how we use the 'unknown absence' or ? code. From now on, it is important to know that if we aren't notified with a reason for a child's absence, the child will be marked as 'Truant'. This is a Ministry of Education change from just leaving them as ? or unexplained which has now become a 'temporary' code.

There are a number of ways you can contact us to advise us of an absence – you can call school and leave a message, you can use the Skool Loop App, text a reply to the absence text or send an old school note when your child returns to school



You can see from the table above that our year 1 and 2 students have the highest proportion of 'chronic' absence. This is a real concern for us, as the junior school is where we build routine and expectations around school attendance.

As the education system moves more into a knowledge based curriculum, missing regular days will make learning for our children who have frequent absences more challenging. Each lesson, particularly in Phase 1 (years 0-3) builds on previous lessons and assumes that children are present to have key concepts taught and developed through multiple exposures.

If you are facing challenges with getting your child to school, please let us know. If we have concerns, our first step is to contact families and walk about any barriers. If there is no improvement, we move on to sending formal letters and then contacting the Attendance Service. At each step we will try to engage whanau and work with you to set goals and remove any barriers.

Property: In the October holidays we will begin our classroom refurbishments. This programme of works is quite extensive and will run through term 3 and into the summer break. This work includes the upgrade of most toilet blocks, carpet and wall coverings in 10 class rooms and new joinery in 7 rooms. This may mean that there is some disruption to classes in term 4 with classes working in the hall for 2-3 weeks. If there are any 'out of bounds' areas, we will keep you posted.

Work on our fale will begin in October as well, with a planned opening in December. There will be an opportunity for our community to participate in the designs that will be embedded in the roof of the fale. The plan is to have each of our Pasifika communities to be represented.

Student Data: With reports going home last term, the board discussed our mid term student data. There are some clear areas of success for us to celebrate. For example 82% of children in year 1 are At or Above expectation in maths at the mid point, 63% of our year 8 learners are At or Above expectation in reading and there was a 12% improvement for our year 8s in writing compared to 2024!

There may be some unexpected shifts in your child's data this year compared to last year and this could reflect the change in curriculum expectations. With the new curriculum the expectations have become more explicit and what is expected at each level have become slightly higher. As schools around the country begin to implement these new, raised expectations, we will see more consistency embedded. If you have any concerns, or need help to better understand your child's report, please talk to your child's teacher at the parent interviews or make a time to talk to them.

Bilingual Education: In 2026 our plan is to increase our classes in Māori bilingual from 1 to 2. We will be looking for expressions of interest from whanau with students who will be in years 3-6 in 2026. These classes will be capped at 18 students in year 0-3 and 23 students in years 4-6 and will have a focus on learning through a tikanga lens. We will be holding a whanau hui later in term 3 to share more details.


