'Out of Zone' enrolments for 2026 close on 8 October 2025 with the ballot being drawn on 15 October. if your child is turning 5 next year and you are living outside of our zone, please fill in an out of zone enrolment to avoid disappointment. Once you have been accepted, your place is secure. Currently there will be no 'out of zone' spaces available for 2025 in Kahukura, we can place your child on out waitlist.

Being aware of students joining us, helps us to plan for staffing and resourcing.

SCHOOL STREETS TRIAL - From the Auckland Transport Notice

Keegan Road closure. Plans are underway for Auckland Transport to consult with our wider community regarding the closure of Keegan Drive during busy times to reduce the risk of harm to our tamariki when coming to school.

Improving safety for children walking to and from Lincoln Heights School

Illegal parking near the school gate during busy hours in the morning and afternoon creates safety and accessibility issues for students and residents along Keegan Drive.

The changes we're making by 2025 - School Term 4:

- Setting up cones from #13 Keegan Drive to #42 Keegan Drive to create a barrier during school pick up (8.15am to 9.15am) and drop off times (2.15pm to 3.15pm)
- Installing "School Street" signs indicating the time the road is being closed during school days

Restricted access is for non-residents during the scheduled times. There will be an assigned staff member managing the traffic cones to ensure access for residents.

Benefits to your community

- Ensures tamariki can walk safely outside the school gate especially during busy hours
- Gives everyone a better view of the road as the area outside the school is always kept clear
- Relieves traffic issues and congestion for residents during pick up and drop off hours as parents and caregivers can only park outside the restricted section of Keegan Drive

What happens next


- We will be in touch with local residents and businesses prior to any work taking place.
- Any change to the plan will be updated on our website.
- We encourage the community to monitor and observe the impact of these changes and provide feedback once the "School Street" is in place, so we can address concerns and make improvements as needed.

Many parents have asked about how students will be walked down the road and how collecting juniors from class will work. We can assure you that children will be walked down to the meeting place and that there will be staff at the collection point. This is a trial and if it doesn't work, we will need to go back to the drawing board.

Strategic Planning 2026 - 2029

Lost Property and uniforms



We have seen some recent posts about jackets and uniforms getting lost. Our staff try really hard to return uniforms to children and we collect and return named uniforms — sadly the tags fade and can be removed. If you have a green jacket or senior hoodie or school hat, you can get your child's name (first or last) printed on the back. This makes the jacket unwearable by anyone else and easy to return. If you want to use the jacket for younger siblings, then use your family name.

We have recently noticed an increase in non-uniform jackets, hoodies and pants. Any blue pants/shorts are fine, but children are expected to wear a uniform jacket or the Kidscan black jacket. If you need a Kidscan jacket, please let us know.


SPORTS NOTICES


